

Hamlet of Great Bend

Resources are located between NYS DOT Start/End Mile Point Jefferson County 8.89 through 10.44

Located in northern Jefferson County in the Town of Champion along Route 3, early settlers first constructed a dam and grist mill in 1807 following the 1804 construction of a bridge across the Black River. The bountiful natural resource of wood and water influenced community development as well as its strategic location to travel routes. The Great Bend Paper & Pulp Company, small dairy and crop farms, complementary retail services supporting development, and a tourist economy supported by visitors traversing to and from other destinations were key businesses supporting the local economy.

Strategically located at the intersection of Route 3 and 26 and its proximity to Fort Drum, visitors continue to access retail services and/or explore points of interest in the quaint community. A newly constructed infrastructure along Route 3 and cooperative municipal efforts to implement a planning process to guide development along the corridor provide enhanced opportunities for economic development while encouraging visitors to explore points of interest.
