


## Northern Border Regional Commission


### Investments Across Region

- FFY 2018 Program Year
  - 89 Applications for \$26,176,965
  - 46 Grants for \$11,546,840






## State Economic & Infrastructure Development Grant

Northern Border Regional Commission Distress Criteria 2019

- Distressed %20 Minimum Required
- Transitional %50 Minimum
  Match Required
- Attainment non eligible county







#### Eligible Applicants

- State governments, local governments and Indian tribes
- Regional planning commissions, state authorities

#### **Ineligible Applicants**

- For-profit entities, LLCs and other entities that are not a 501(c)
- Normally eligible entities, deemed ineligible due to prior federal or state funding history
- Prior recipients with less than 75% project completion





#### Eligible Funding Categories

- Infrastructure (transportation, basic public infrastructure and telecommunications)
   Workforce education, entrepreneurship, and business development
- Basic health care and other public services to assist economically distressed areas
- Resource conservation, tourism, recreation, and preservation of open space
- Development of renewable and alternative energy sources

#### Ineligible Uses

- Pass-through funding
- Business relation location assistance
- Funding to "supplant" existing federal programs.
- Promotion of unfair competition between businesses





#### Project Funding and Match

- \$500,000 for an infrastructure project
- \$250,000 for all other project types
- Grants are reimbursements of previously paid and eligible expenses


#### **Project Match**

- 20% match in distressed counties
- 50% match in transitional counties
- Federal funds can be used as match
  - All federal funding is capped at 80% per project

- Average the county distress criteria

Regional Forest Economy Partnership





#### Purpose:

To address the economic shift produced by the chronic and consistent decline of the forest products industry that has led to displacement of a skilled workforce and significant negative demographic changes in the rural areas of the Northern Border Regional Commission region.

#### Goal:

Fund projects that, when completed, increase the ability of the four-state region to attract new opportunities, that are highly leveraged, transformational investments that have a fundamental impact on community economic revitalization.


All the same regulations and congressional directives apply


- Distress Criteria used to determine minimum required match
- 50 % of Appropriations used in Distressed counties
- 40% of Appropriations spent on Infrastructure
- Eligible Applicants
  - Local Governments, Political subdivisions, non-profits, Indian Tribes
- 80% cap on federal dollars in any project











#### Threshold Criteria









- Evaluation Advisory Team
- Invitation to submit full application
- 2 years to complete projects
- 6 months to complete funding
- Projects that are regional in scope





#### **New York 2018 NBRC Applications by Category**








#### **New York 2018 NBRC Applications by County**








#### **New York NBRC Awards since 2011 - 2017 by Category**

Regional Significance and Long-Term Impact

- Job creation and retention
- Investment in downtowns
- Geographic distribution
- Delivery of a critical service
- Uniqueness and innovation

#### **Project Need**

Meets a critical opportunity for communities impacted





#### **New York State Review Criteria**

#### **Project Impact**

- Project outputs and outcomes are clearly defined and reliable
- Cost benefit of the project measured against NBRC investment

#### Implementation Capacity and Commitment

- Sponsor's commitment to the project, credentials and track record
- Project readiness, including requisite approvals

Budget, Work Plan and Timeline





#### 2011 Grant

Clayton Local Development Corporation - \$250,000

Installation of basic public utilities at the Frink America site on the St. Lawrence River.

Remediated brownfield, required removal of all existing utilities on the site.

Parcel marketed for hotel development.

\$20 million investment, creates an estimated 80 full-time equivalent jobs.







#### 2014 Grant

Hudson Headwaters Health Network - \$250,000

Construction of a new community health center in Champlain, Clinton County

Built to manage a 30% increase to existing facility.

25,916 square feet health center, located on Route 11, just east of the Northway. Construction is expected to begin this spring and cost about \$9 million to build and outfit.







**2016 Grant** 

Clarkson University - \$250,000

Conversion of Damon Hall into light manufacturing incubator space, creating new spaces for startups

Building upon Clarkson's Shipley Center for Innovation's success which had created 147 business startups with 382 active projects currently in the pipeline across the North Country region







**2013 Grant** 

Port of Oswego Authority - \$192,000

Rail spur construction and additional rail car storage

Only deep-water port on the U.S. shores of Lake Ontario

Enhance the port's accessibility for international shipping
