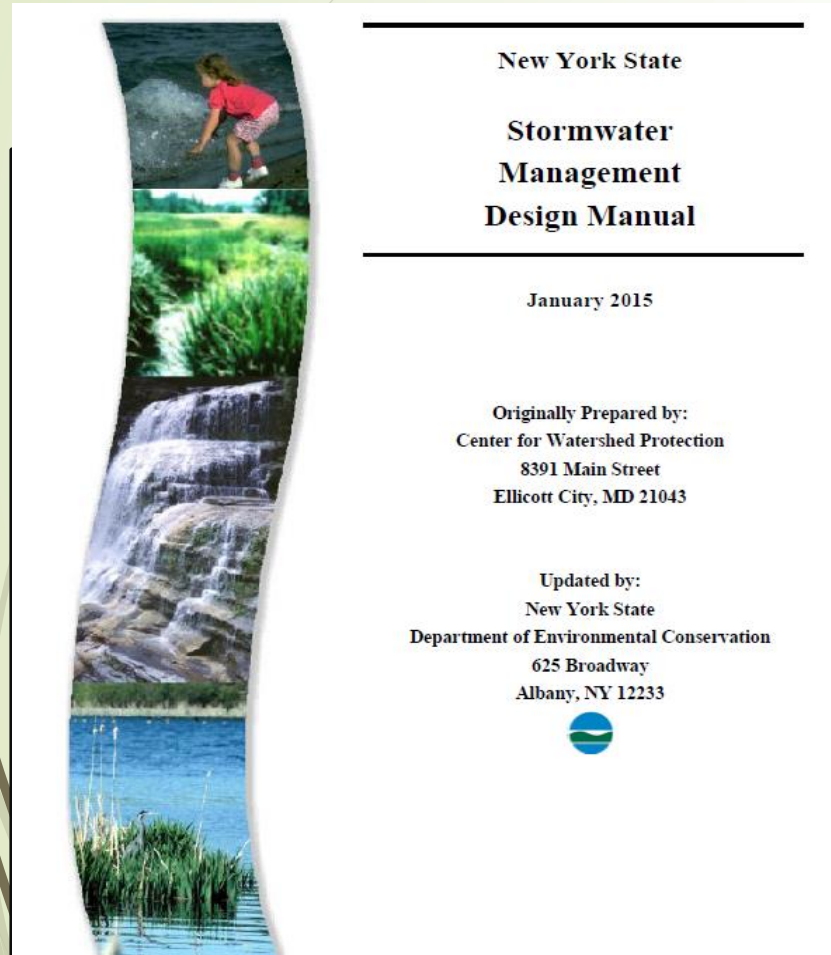


17 – Outfalls inspected

Construction Site and Post-Construction Site Runoff Control

Before commencing construction activity, the owner or operator of a construction project that will involve soil disturbance of one or more acres must obtain coverage under the State Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (SPDES) General Permit for Stormwater Discharges from Construction Activity.

Construction Site and Post-Construction Site Runoff Control



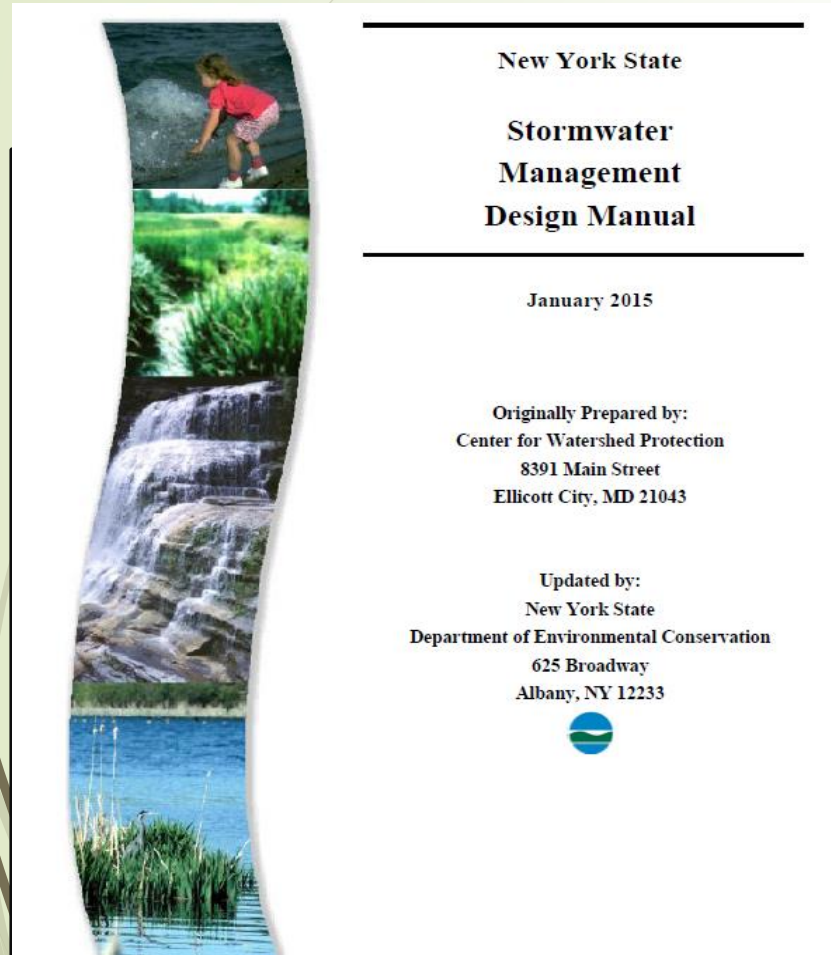
- 4 - Notice of Intent (NOI) and Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) for construction projects
- 5 - Post construction practices inspected
- 8 - Post construction practices inventoried
- 3 - Post construction practices maintained
- 1 - Notice of violation (NOV)

1935 - miles of street swept

25 – acres of parking lots swept

481 – number of catch basins cleaned
